The OGP Multi Donor Trust Fund aims to support countries in delivering real impact



The objectives of the OGP
Multi Donor Trust Fund (MDTF)
are to:

- Enhance the capacity of countries to develop and implement country-led commitments on open government.
- Increase the expansion and dissemination of knowledge on the effectiveness and impact of open government reforms.
- Provide programmatic support to the OGP Support Unit.

The OGP MDTF mirrors the spirit and values of the OGP

- National/local OGP actors are at the driver's seat to determine activities to be funded by the OGP MDTF.
 - Multi-stakeholder forums must endorse requests for funding.
- MDTF is designed to maintain parity between government and civil society stakeholders.
 - One government and one civil society representative in the MDTF Council.
 - Recipients may be government, civil society or research institutes.

Objective of supporting to implementation of commitments




Selection Criteria

A country or local is expected to submit only one EOI for one commitment (area) included in current Action Plan.



- An ambitious commitment:
 - o a major step forward in the relevant policy area; and
 - faces clear political-economy, technical and financial challenges in implementation.
- Sustainability.
- A regular and fully functioning multi stakeholder forum (MSF).
- Favorable/authorizing environment.
- Inclusion.
- Demonstrate a need for supplemental funding.
- Alignment with the country's development agenda, OGP values, and WB country strategy.

Eligible recipients



Eligible countries and locals:

- Countries that submitted an Action Plan in 2016 or 2017 or locals that submitted an Action Plan in 2016;
- 2. Have a multi-stakeholder forum as defined by the OGP Support Unit
- 3. Are countries where the World Bank work and provide lending


What you need to submit along with your EOI



- 1 A letter signed by a highlevel official of the agency implementing the reform (if different from POC) stating their commitment to carry out the project.
- 2 A letter from minister of OGP lead agency (POC) stating their commitment to include the commitment in the next Action Plan(s) to ensure sustained monitoring by the IRM.
- A letter from the MSF supporting the submission of the EOI (see website for format).



Selection Process and Timeline



- POCs submit notification of intent to submit EOI.
- Multi-stakeholder forum discusses and endorses.
- POC submits EOIs with letter from Implementing Agency and MSF.
- MDTF Team
 evaluates EOIs and
 provides
 recommendations
 to MDTF Council.
- · Council endorses.

Project Team (Implementing Agency and World Bank Task Team Leader):

- Undertakes Integrated Assessment Framework (fiduciary, administrative and safeguard checks).
- Refines problem identification, designs components, and implementation mechanisms with input from WB and OGP SU.
- Builds coalition for implementation with MSF.

Project Team

- Implements activities.
- Coordinates with MSF.
- Reports to MDTF.

Grant package will be implemented through different financing mechanisms to be determined at Post-Endorsement phase

A minimum of 4 grants for USD 150,000 to 400,000 over two to three years each

Recipient-Executed Grants


Direct grants to government for technical implementation.

Bank-Executed Technical Assistance

Complementary financing for training, consultants, supervision.



The two mechanisms offer flexibility and customizable package of activities to support successful implementation of commitments



An example of the support from the MDTF to achieve a country's open government reform objective

Pre-Endorsement - EOI

Commitment in Action Plan:

Launch open contracting platform to conduct deals electronically and transparently

Implementing Agency:

State Procurement Agency

Implementation Challenge:

Limited expertise to meet Open Contracting Data Standard and in gathering citizen voice in procurement process to identify corruption risk. 2

Post-Endorsement – Project Appraisal, Concept Note and Grant Agreement

Components of Support from MDTF



Recipient-Executed Grant implemented by the State Procurement Agency.

- Identify and implement actions to meet Open Contracting Data Standard.
- Build on e-procurement platform to offer channel for citizen feedback.




Bank-Executed Award implemented by nongovernment entity or group of consultants.

 Raise awareness and build capacity of civil society and citizens to monitor procurement corruption.

What you need to do next

- Discuss with MSF which commitment:
 - faces implementation challenges
 - o is ambitious
 - would benefit from World Bank's technical specialty.
- Email the World Bank and OGP Country Support team to notify intent to submit EOI.
