

The diversity of OGP participants in Brazil and the level of collaboration between government and civil society have improved significantly over time. While some commitments have led to major improvements in open government, there is a need for more ambitious commitments that address national priorities such as anti-corruption.

NOTEWORTHY COMMITMENTS

SOCIAL PARTICIPATION

Develop the Participa.br portal to improve opportunities for social participation and facilitate dialogue between government and citizens.

BETTER LAND GOVERNANCE

Publish georeferenced land data for both public and private lands through the Land Management System (SIGEF).

TRANSPARENT BRAZIL

Support the implementation of the Access to Information Law at the local level through a regional transparency index, technical support, and trainings.



Co-Creation and Decision Making


The level of collaboration between government and civil society has improved over time. There is also a greater diversity of CSOs and government institutions that participate in OGP, including all three branches of government, as well as state and municipal governments. Another important development is the establishment of a civil society working group. The figures below show who was involved in the development of the third action plan (2016-2018), as well as the levels of public influence during the first two plans.

No/little civil society involvement





LEVEL OF PUBLIC INFLUENCE?



Commitment Performance

Brazil has achieved high rates of implementation, and some commitments have significantly improved social participation, corporate transparency, and consumer protection. However, most commitments have not been transformative. The third action plan is a step forward because it includes fewer, more ambitious commitments, in new areas such as the penitentiary system, the courts, and the environment. The figures below show the levels of completion and ambition of the first two action plans, as well as how they compare to the regional average of the latest round of plans.

Recommendations

NEW METHOD FOR CONSULTATIONS

Increase the time for deliberations to incentivize more ambitious commitments.

ADDRESS **KEY TOPICS**

Address key areas on the public agenda, such as political party financing and public-private sector corruption.

PRIVATE SECTOR **ENGAGEMENT**

Further engage businesses to raise awareness of open business models and promote open government principles in the private sector.

DIVERSITY OF GOVERNMENT PARTICIPATION

Include more nonfederal branches of the government (such as the Public Prosecutor's Office), as well as cities and other subnational entities.
