- Threats to democracy are emerging and disinformation is spreading.
- Digital tools are raising citizens' expectations of their leaders.

Open government has a critical role in bolstering opportunities for public good through digital:

- Help governments ensure they serve their people in ways that are efficient and fair.
- Help deploy new, digital tools that make government processes inclusive and citizen-centric.

The Open Government Partnership (OGP) is the leading global forum for advancing open government.








Opportunities for leadership:

- **Tackle challenges of disinformation and “fake news”**
 - Explore policy measures around misuse of digital media
- **Improve civil society-state relations**
 - Meet or exceed the OGP’s requirements on multi-stakeholder forums
 - Strengthen safeguards for activists and journalists
- **Defend civic space**
 - Protect human rights including freedom of expression, association and assembly



Actions for a more inclusive OGP



Opportunities for leadership:

- **Make co-creation and consultation more inclusive**
 - Include diverse civil society groups, including those working on gender equality, in open government processes
- **Mainstream inclusion through action plans**
 - Conduct gender-based analysis of action plans
 - Push towards gender disaggregated data
 - Design action plan commitments that address a specific gap in women and girls' service or policy needs.



Actions to create impact for digital democracy



Opportunities for leadership:

- **Protect citizen rights in the digital age**
 - Develop and implement commitments that protect rights around data and privacy
 - Improve internet access and control
- **Support responsible and ethical use of emerging technology**
 - Participate in global policy discussions on how AI can be made more open and responsible
 - Improve transparency of public algorithms and source codes

December	•OGP to present update on outcomes to the Steering Committee and potentially publish

**Advancing the Priorities of the 2019
Ottawa OGP Global Summit**

The co-chairs of the OGP Steering Committee, the Government of Canada and Nathaniel Heller, have identified two overall priorities of the 6th OGP Global Summit taking place in Ottawa, Canada on May 29-31:

- 1) Advancing gender equality and inclusion through open government; and
- 2) Strengthening democracy and protecting civic rights in the digital era.

In advance of the Summit, we call on all fellow OGP governments to support and take a concrete action on at least one of the two priorities. We invite you to share how your government is concretely supporting these priorities in your current or future action plans. All relevant actions will be evaluated and showcased throughout the summit, shared on social media, and could include a speaking opportunity for you to share your country's actions on these areas.

If you would like your actions to be showcased and/or considered for a speaking role, please submit this information by May 15. Actions will continue to be collected on a rolling basis throughout the Summit. Please note that only actions submitted through this form will be taken into consideration.
