Dear Co-Chairs of the Open Government Partnership:

The Government of the State of Mexico recognizes the importance of the Open Government Partnership as a multilateral and international linkage mechanism that actively supports national and local governments and civil society, to promote transparency, strengthen democratic mechanisms, citizen participation and the use of information and communication technologies.

As part of the formalization of the 2020 Open Government Partnership process, the State of Mexico makes its own expression of interest to join this multilateral Alliance, with the conviction that the Action Plan that will be developed will allow to reduce legal marginalization and promote citizen participation in the development of state public policies.

One of the public policy co-creation projects between the government and civil society that this state has implemented are the Caravans for Daily Justice, which aim to eliminate barriers to access to justice, to reduce legal marginalization, as well as bring closer procedures and services to remote or hard-to-reach communities

This project has been supported by an Advisory Council made up of the Mexican Institute for Competitiveness, Borde Político, México Evalúa, the Center of Research and





Economics Teaching, the Institute of Legal Research of the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México, and the Instituto Tecnológico de Estudios Superiores de Monterrey, Campus Toluca, which measures and evaluates the operation of the Caravans for Daily Justice.

Convinced that the collaboration and exchange of experiences, technical assistance and joint capacity development contribute to the strengthening of an open government in the state, in coordination with the Municipality of TlaInepantla de Baz, we will have to generate co-creation projects to promote the coordination of public policies between both jurisdictions, aimed to strengthen transparency, access to public information, citizen participation and anti-corruption actions.

Therefore, our commitment to the Open Government Partnership is an undisputed sign of the responsible work that our entity does and that under a framework of values and principles of this Alliance, will facilitate that people participate actively in public decisions, which will promote a closer and more efficient government.
