COMMITMENT PERFORMANCE

According to OGP's Independent Reporting Mechanism (IRM), national commitments in Africa and the Middle East:

- are similar in **ambition** than those in other regions (42% in Africa vs. 43% in other regions),
- are less **complete** (45% in Africa vs. 58% in other regions),
- and achieve similar strong **early results** (16% in Africa vs. 21% in other regions).

OVERVIEW OF THEMATIC AREAS

Countries in Africa and the Middle East have made many anti-corruption and fiscal openness commitments, but few commitments in areas like civic space and digital governance.

OGP PROCESS

- According to the IRM, **over 90%** of OGP countries in Africa and the Middle East used a multistakeholder forum to co-create their most recently evaluated action plan.
- Governments in **85%** of OGP countries in Africa and the Middle East provided a reasoned response to the public explaining why certain priorities, ideas or activities were or were not included in their action plan, as part of their most recently evaluated co-creation process.

LOCAL MEMBERS

- So far, **12** local members in Africa and the Middle East have submitted at least one action plan. Combined, they have made **60** commitments.
- Popular policy areas among participating locals in Africa and the Middle East:
 - **Fiscal openness** (21 commitments)
 - Inclusion (20 commitments)
 - Anti-corruption (13 commitments)
 - **Public services** (12 commitments)
 - Natural resources (11 commitments)
