2. Electing the next Steering Committee Government Chairs

Following the conclusion of the <u>2023 Steering Committee government elections</u>, all government members (including newly elected) were invited to consider running for co-chairs of the Steering Committee. Two sets of co-chairs are being recruited this year, one to begin as Lead Chair on October 1, 2023, and one to begin as Lead Chair on October 1, 2024 (after serving as 'Incoming Chair' until then).

The deadline for government candidates is May 26. Candidates are invited to present their candidacy to the rest of the Steering Committee on May 31. If there are more than two candidates, the Steering Committee will vote to elect the new co-chairs (vote would be virtually, and SC members would have a few days after the meeting to cast their vote). Candidacy letters will be shared ahead of the May 31 meeting.

Note: the call for civil society co-chairs will go out once the selection of new members is concluded in mid-June.

3. Operationalizing the OGP Strategy 2023–2028

The Support Unit will present the approach to operationalize OGP's new strategy, with a focus on the first year of its implementation (April 2023 through March 2024). This item is broken down into three, mutually reinforcing components for Steering Committee discussion:

a. Role of the Steering Committee (at working level and ministerial levels) Reference Material: Memo on Role of the SC in Operationalizing the OGP Strategy

- How does the proposed role of the Steering Committee align with the overall objectives and goals of the strategy?
- What strategies should be employed to foster greater accountability and ownership among all stakeholders involved in implementing the strategy?

b. Resourcing: Strategy to Raise OGP country contributions

Reference Material: <u>Proposal to Raise OGP Country Contributions</u>

Resolution: Proposed changes to country contribution levels [for SC approval]

- What strategies can be implemented to increase the number of contributing countries?
- How can we position the summit to achieve these objectives?

c. Leveraging the OGP Global Summit

Reference Material: Proposal of ministerial activities

- How can we strategically leverage the summit to accelerate the implementation of our strategy and achieve maximum impact?
- What specific roles and actions can ministers, both within and outside the Steering Committee, undertake to amplify the political relevance of the strategy, ensuring its recognition and support across different stakeholders?
- How can we effectively mobilize and incentivize a high turnout of ministerial participation?
