América Abierta 2024 Fact Sheet

OGP members are working to root out undue influence across national and local governments to combat corruption. Using public office for private gain erodes trust in government and its ability to meet citizen needs. Anti-corruption commitments in the Americas region focus on public procurement (including open contracting), anti-corruption institutions, and audits.

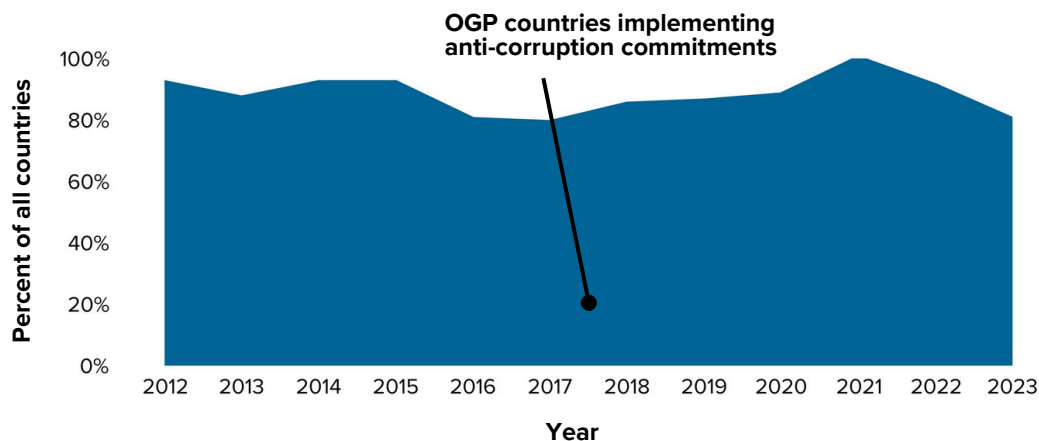

ANTI-CORRUPTION COMMITMENTS IN THE AMERICAS

Six governments (five national and one local) from the Americas have successfully submitted **nine** anti-corruption commitments to the Open Gov Challenge. Explore examples from the Challenge and beyond.

CHALLENGE

Open Contracting for Federal Infrastructure Projects



Brazil [committed](#) to improving the public procurement portal using open contracting principles and disclosing information for all federal infrastructure projects.

CHALLENGE

Implement the National Public Integrity Strategy (ENIP)



Chile [committed](#) to implementing a national public integrity strategy to increase trust in the country's institutions and fight corruption.

CHALLENGE

Open Contracting for Infrastructure Projects



Santiago de Cali (Colombia) [committed](#) to building a tool to centralize and publish contracting data and increase outreach to new bidders within the national action plan.

CHALLENGE

Increase Citizen Monitoring of Public Infrastructure Contracts



Honduras [committed](#) to improving citizen monitoring of public infrastructure contracts by raising awareness and making data more accessible.

CHALLENGE

Implement the National Anti-Corruption Policy (PNA)



Mexico [committed](#) to implementing a new National Anti-Corruption Policy to improve coordination between agencies and increase public participation.

CHALLENGE

Create a Monitoring Platform for Public Works Projects



Yerba Buena (Argentina) [committed](#) to implementing a public works platform to provide residents real-time information on the progress and funding of projects.

ACTION PLAN

Training on Public Procurement Risk Management



Santa Catarina (Brazil) [published](#) a Procurement Transparency Protocol and trained public officials in procurement risk management.

ACTION PLAN

Create a Public Beneficial Ownership Register



Ecuador [is working](#) to train public officials on beneficial ownership, analyze current levels of transparency on this topic, and implement a public register.
