Dear Co-Chairs of the Open Government Partnership,

**Subject: Letter of Intent of the Kingdom of Thailand to Participate  
in the Open Government Partnership**

On behalf of the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand, I have the honour to inform you that the Kingdom of Thailand wishes to be formally admitted as a member of the Open Government Partnership (OGP), following the Cabinet's resolution adopted on December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025, approving Thailand's application for OGP membership.

Open Government Partnership confirmed in July 2025 that the Kingdom of Thailand met the eligibility criteria for OGP membership; reflecting the Government's continued commitment to promoting open, transparent, and accountable public administration, as well as fostering inclusive participation from all sectors in policy formulation and public service delivery. These efforts aim to enhance standards of good governance and strengthen public trust, both domestically and within the international community. In this regard, I am confident that Thailand's participation in the OGP will further accelerate key reforms aligned with the country's national development priorities.

Upon admission as a member of the Open Government Partnership, the Kingdom of Thailand intends to actively leverage the OGP platform to deepen cooperation with other governments and civil society organizations in advancing reforms that promote openness, transparency, and accountability. Thailand also looks forward to benefiting from the exchange of best practices and mutual learning with fellow OGP members.

To ensure effective coordination and implementation of Thailand's commitments under the OGP framework, the Cabinet, pursuant to its Resolution of December 4<sup>th</sup>, 2018, designated the Office of the Public Sector Development Commission (OPDC) as the lead agency for OGP membership. Furthermore, pursuant to the Cabinet Resolution of December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025, two levels of Points of Contact have been designated as follows: **(1) High-Level Point of Contact (Political Level):**


The Deputy Prime Minister assigned by the Prime Minister to chair the Public Sector Development Commission (PDC), or the Minister appointed as Vice-Chair of the PDC, is assigned as the official political representative. **(2) High-Level Point of Contact (Civil Servant Level):** The Secretary-General of the Public Sector Development Commission is assigned as the principal coordinator linking the Government with technical experts and relevant stakeholders, and will be responsible for the formulation, coordination, and oversight of the implementation of the National Action Plan (NAP).

The Government of Thailand stands ready to work closely with civil society organizations (CSOs), the private sector, and international partners in the development and implementation of the National Action Plan under the OGP framework, and respectfully requests your continued guidance and support throughout Thailand's accession process.

I would also like to express our sincere appreciation for the opportunity to join and actively participate in the global community committed to advancing the principles of the Open Government Partnership.

In reaffirming this intent, the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand fully endorses the Open Government Partnership and the principles enshrined in the Open Government Declaration.
