- a. The Support Unit (SU) presented an initial overview of priorities to help transform and reposition OGP over the next 18 months. The reimaging of OGP is already anticipated in the current strategy, but the current geopolitical context and the challenging funding landscape make the need more explicit and urgent. The transformation agenda builds on OGP's 2023–2028 strategy and is structured around five outcomes:
 - a. OGP is relevant & valued, supported, and visible in key spaces.
 - b. OGP has an upgraded member services model.
 - c. OGP is sustainably funded.
 - d. OGP is focused and delivers impact.
 - e. OGP is a stronger organization.
