







MEMORANDUM OF INTENTIONS

VANADZOR-GYUMRI LOCAL OPEN GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIP JOINT ACTION PLAN

Introduction:

The Government of Armenia joined the Open Government Partnership (OGP) Initiative in 2011 and created its First action plan in 2012.

The <u>2018-2020 National action plan</u> and the commitments were the most ambitious and transformative.

Local government reform has always been at the interest of the OGP agenda. The principles of democracy, good governance, and the reduction of corruption, participatory governance have been applied not only to the executive but also to the legislature and local communities.

In 2020, the OGP-Armenia Secretariat kicked off meetings and discussions with the Ministry of Territorial Administration and Infrastructure and with representatives of large communities. As a result, were agreed the communities of Gyumri-Vanadzor to join the Local-OGP process on a joint (consortium) basis. These jurisdictions have a path of experience of the participatory processes and have succeeded in achieving dialogue with the community stakeholders and other organizations.

During the regular online meetings in June-August Vanadzor and Gyumri Municipalities, OGP-Armenia Secretariat, Civil Society Partners, USAID, UNDP, Council of Europe, GIZ and other stakeholders agreed on putting efforts to establish effective dialogue for the Vanadzor-Gyumri Local OGP co-creation.

In October 2020, the mayors of Vanadzor and Gyumri submit an application/EOI to the Local-OGP Support Unite for considering a joint application of Vanadzor-Gyumri (consortium) for the

Local-OGP membership. Finally, the consortium of these <u>communities officially has become</u> <u>Local-OGP community's member</u>.

Despite the challenges of 2020, the Covid-19, and <u>Azerbaijan's rampant war against Artsakh</u>, the communities of Vanadzor and Gyumri have kicked off the co-creation processes.

In March-April of 2021, with the support of the OGP-Armenia Secretariat and the UNDP-Armenia office were organized a series of skills development and capacity building courses for the partners of Vanadzor and Gyumri communities' administrations and Civil Society Organizations.

The trainings' component presented the general concept of the Open Government and the role/importance of the electronic democratic instruments developed in Armenia (also during the Covid-19). A total of 70 participants were trained.

In April, Vanadzor and Gyumri municipalities announced <u>an open call-invitation</u> for the cooperation. The call was directed to the community partners and stakeholders then were followed by an open call for the proposals collections (Vanadzor: https://bit.ly/3nrTO6g). The Communities proposed 8 main directions which could be helpful with the proposal's orientation. About 16 CSOs from two communities expressed their willingness to participate.

All in all, were collected 30 proposals, many of which were either duplicated in content that didn't comply with the OGP principles, or were subject to revision or discussion.

On these issues, on 29th July (2021), with the assistance of the OGP-Armenia Secretariat, EC Office-Armenia and the Ministry of Territorial Administration and Infrastructure was held a joint (hybrid) meeting of Vanadzor and Gyumri communities' municipalities and CSOs representatives. The participants discussed the proposals together, classified them into digital, innovation, and participatory. As a result, these proposals were discussed and adjusted with the municipalities' administrations.

Strategic vision

The Vanadzor-Gyumri communities are one of the largest and progressive communities in Armenia. In recent years, communities have stood out for initiatives that have helped increase the transparency of local governments, improve participatory processes, and constructive collaboration with international and local CSO partners.

At the beginning of the Local-OGP membership, community representatives, CSO partners took into account the available community experience and resources, responsibilities, local characteristics, the current economic and political situation in the country, as well as forecasts of future development.

As of 1 February 2021, these two communities and the Municipality of Pila (Poland) - signed the EU Alliance for Sustainable Green Governance (CPC ALLIANCE) ABC.GoV. Members of the Alliance for Better City Governance (in Armenian). The program includes areas such as improving policies and instruments for sustainable urban management, creating a clean environment, green public transport, recycling and building the capacity of local workers.

All stakeholders of Vanadzor and Gyumri communities agreed for overcoming economic, social and educational development problems in the communities, it is necessary to provide institutional

mechanisms for participatory and democratic actions, integrity and for the formation of communities' local professionals' staff.

The second part of this Memorandum envisaged commitments that significantly will improve the transparency, governance mechanisms and public oversight of community resources. The issue of effective management of community resources is a goal not only for these communities but also for all communities in Armenia. At first, these commitments will clarify and identify communities' resources (property - not property), then will define the mechanisms for their management, donations and utilization. This intends the creating an open community resources registry.

The structure of the community budgets, its inputs, and outputs are always subject of interest for the community members and international organizations. Often the information is provided in too numerous, unreliable sources. Thus, the introduction of an "interactive" or "open data" format for presenting community budgets can significantly improve public perception of community budgets, transparency, and increase trust in community authorities.

Environmental issues and the safety of public transport have remained the focus of attention for many years. Public controlling of transportation and participation in improvement processes could help to ensure a safer transport system.

The "green" transport commitment is presented, as it would significantly improve the environmental situation - public control over public transportation.

Many of the above-listed priorities require a long-term correct study, formulation, oversight and monitoring. Given these challenges, the resources and expertise of the municipality may not be sufficient to meet these obligations. Constructive dialogue and cooperation with CSOs, Private Sector and International organizations could guarantee reaching ambitious agenda and for the best fulfillment of the undertaken commitments.

After the final adoption of the Vanadzor-Gyumri Local-OGP action plan, the municipalities will form Working groups (for each community) to assist municipalities in organizing public discussions on the implementation of commitments, educational processes for the special commitments, organizing specific campaigns to inform the public about the Local-OGP actions and launch public monitoring mechanism. Thus, municipalities will work with Local-OGP partners on a joint agenda by mutual agreement.

CSO partners and other organizations can organize and create an independent monitoring mechanism to support the Local-OGP's co-creation, implementation and undertake a review of the priorities of the next plas.

regulation	In this regard, it is quite important to clarify and introduce competition procedures and mechanisms for community property resources. An existing or newly created electronic community resource inventory application/tool (defining what counts as a community resource) should be used to clarify procedures for each use (grants, assistance/aid, donations, sale, auction, rent, etc.). Often grants are provided from the municipal budget of a particular organization, assistance to citizens and other donations about which there is no reliable information. Developing a reporting and monitoring mechanism will help improve the effective management of community resources.

In order to regulate the sector, it is necessary to carry out comprehensive monitoring to record the mentioned problems, to offer solutions, to hold transparent tenders with the involvement of civil society, to install electronic information systems at bus stops.
Brief description of the commitment		Within the framework of the EU "Alliance for Sustainable Green Governance Program", the communities of Vanadzor and Gyumri will purchase 5 electric buses (for each community), which will serve the inner-city routes. Charging stations will be installed, a ticket validation system will be introduced. In addition, the idea of Green Transport will be taught to the public through campaigns, trainings and other programs. In order to complete the program and to adapt it to digital technologies, it is necessary to create a mobile application, which will contain both maps of the inner-city routes and roads, as well as the vehicles serving those routes and roads, information on their technical condition, drivers and service. With the help of the application, it will be possible to see and follow where the vehicle of the given number is at the moment, how long it will be at the stop. In addition, a vehicle information board / Tablo / will be installed at the bus stops, which will inform about the arrival of the vehicle through the countdown.
