Dear Mayor Passerini,

On behalf of the Open Government Partnership (OGP), I extend our congratulations for being elected for this next administrative term in Cordoba Municipality.

OGP was founded by Heads of State and civil society leaders at the UN General Assembly in 2011 with a clear vision: to drive governments toward greater transparency, accountability, and responsiveness to their citizens. This mission is critical, now more than ever, to meet the challenges facing our communities, like climate change, inequality, and polarization. In the last decade, 76 countries and over 150 local governments have joined OGP, alongside thousands of civil society organizations and support from esteemed multilateral partners such as the OECD, UNDP, the European Commission, and the World Bank.

We firmly believe that embracing innovation and pursuing ambitious open government reforms can transformative change may be achieved.

To facilitate this, we launched the [Open Gov Challenge](#) to promote reforms in ten key policy themes to strengthen democracies and improve communities. This year, the [OGP Global Summit](#), a biennial event co-organized by OGP, will be held in Spain from October 7th to 9th. This gathering presents a crucial opportunity for the great OGP community to convene and share valuable experiences in advancing the open government agenda. We hope to see a delegation from Cordoba represented, including yourself.
